BODH GAYA, INDIA

Mahabodhi Temple

Borobudur Temple

The Borobudur Temple Compound is one of the greatest Buddhist monuments in the world. It was built in the 8th and 9th centuries AD during the Syailendra Dynasty.



July 17, 2019


Asalha Puja

HANOI, VIETNAM

Tran Quoc Pagoda

Over 1,500 years old. On the grounds of Tran Quoc is a Bodhi tree taken as cutting of the original tree in Bodh Gaya, India under which the Buddha sat and achieved enlightenment.

HAWAII, USA

Byodo-In Temple (Kaneohe)

Byodo-In Temple in Hawaii is a replica of the historic Byodoin Temple of Uji in Kyoto prefecture of Japan, established in 1052. It is a non-denominational Buddhist temple and welcomes people of all faiths to participate in its traditions.



BANDARBAN, BANGLADESH

Buddha Dhatu Jadi

"Dhatu" are the material remains of a holy person, and in this temple the relics belong to Buddha. It is the largest Theravada Buddhist temple in Bangladesh and has the second-largest Buddha statue in the country. It was built in 2000 in Arakanese architecture, an adoption of the South East Asia style.

BRITISH COLUMBIA CANADA

Tashi Choling

Tashi Choling International Gompa is the retreat centre of Gaden for the West, under the spiritual direction of H.E. Zasep Rinpoche. Located near Nelson, in the beautiful mountains of British Columbia Canada, the centre is a sanctuary for retreats and teachings in the Gelugpa tradition of Tibetan Buddhism.



Angkor Wat

Angkor Wat is a temple complex in Cambodia and one of the largest religious monuments in the world, on a site measuring 162.6 hectares. Some visitors do not realize that many surfaces of the Angkor temples were once painted. Today, only small traces of the paint remains on just a few temples.





DAMBULLA, SRI LANKA


Buddhist Cave Temple

Also known as the Golden Temple of Dambulla and is a World Heritage Site (1991) in Sri Lanka. Dambulla is the largest and best-preserved cave temple complex in Sri Lanka. The rock towers 160 m over the surrounding plains. There are more than 80 documented caves in the surrounding area. Major attractions are spread over five caves, which contain statues and paintings.

KHARKHORIN, MONGOLIA

Erdene Zuu Monastery

The Erdene Zuu Monastery is probably the earliest surviving Buddhist monastery in Mongolia. The surrounding wall is made to resemble a Tibetan Buddhist mala featuring 108 Stupas. Today Erdene Zuu remains an active Buddhist monastery as well as a museum that is open to tourists.
